UX Camp Code of Conduct

The purpose of the association is to organise, charter and coordinate some of the activities of the local and global Design & UX community. The UXcamp Dublin Association is looking to create and foster a spirit of sharing knowledge among the UX professionals in Ireland and abroad; The association encourages service minded people to offer their expertise to the community without personal financial reward.

UXcamp Dublin will promote the principles of good Design and take an active interest in the cultural, social and moral welfare of the UX community, by creating and strengthening connections between UX professionals, the industry and the Academia.

'UXcamp Dublin 2016' is an ad-hoc unconference inspired by the more popular event BarCamp, where participants can learn and share their passion about User Experience and related disciplines, such as Information Architecture, Interaction and Visual Design, Service Design, Content Strategy, Psychology, Usability, and many more.

Unlike traditional conference formats, "UXcamp Dublin" has a self-organising character, relying on the passion and the responsibility of the participants. The admission at the event is free of charge. As a not-for-profit community event it relies on sponsors to be able to run the event.

The UX Camp is a platform for celebrating the rich diversity and coming together of the UX community for a respectful exchange of views and ideas.

- Be considerate, constructive and respectful of other people's feedback and views regardless of gender, age, nationality and ethnicity.
- Be respectful of the space within which the event is being held. The Grangegorman has been shared with the community for the day, for sharing a diversity of skills, talents, experiences, cultures, and opinions. - We believe that any misunderstandings can be resolved directly through open dialogue and respectful feedback. If you see someone behaving disrespectfully, do respectfully discourage them from such behaviour.
- If you feel you are being bothered or harassed and are unable to peacefully resolve it, contact the organisers or moderators immediately.
- If the organisers determine that an event participant is behaving disrespectfully, the organisers may take any action they deem appropriate, up to and including expulsion and exclusion from the event.
- As organisers, we would like to resolve issues in a peaceful and positive manner. We expect participants to be responsible people and not let things get out of hand.
